SERVANT OUTREACH PROJECT

The enCircle (formerly Lutheran Family Services of Virginia) Minnick Schools help students ages five to twenty-two who have experienced challenges in public schools reach their academic, behavioral, vocational, and developmental goals. Minnick Schools are licensed by the Virginia Department of Education as private day schools and now serve students in the Bristol, Grundy, Harrisonburg, Lynchburg, Roanoke, Wytheville, and Wise regions. The following supplies are needed: pencils, notebooks, crayons, construction paper, inexpensive calculators, glue sticks, hand sanitizer, paper towels, and facial tissues. KICK OFF A HEALTHY NEW YEAR AND JOIN THE FUN!

Prokudin-Gorskii and the World’s First True Color Photography

Speaker: Lynn Brooks
Retired from Library of Congress Information Technology and Digital Scan Center

At the beginning of the twentieth century, there were two world-wide obsessions: learning to fly and true color photography. Coincident with the Wright Brothers success at Kitty Hawk, true color photography was achieved in the Imperial Russian Empire by Sergei Mikhailovich Prokudin-Gorskii, providing a time capsule of pre-Revolution Russia in color. His existing glass plate negatives ended up at the Library of Congress. Let's see how he worked and samples of that work.

An Epiphany Procession will be presented on Sunday, January 25, at 4:00 p.m., at St. John's Episcopal Church, 205 Elmwood Avenue. Sponsored by the Lynchburg Chapter of the American Guild of Organists, this beautiful and historic liturgy will showcase choirs from St. John's Episcopal Church, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, and St. Paul's Episcopal Church, with lessons and music for the season of Epiphany.

In addition to beautiful choral works—including a piece written by Holy Trinity Organist-Choirmaster Bill Greene—the program will feature several organ pieces performed by Peggy Haas Howell, including an exciting work by Garth Edmundson.

A vibrant service recalling the journey of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus, and Jesus' first miracle at the wedding in Cana, the procession serves as a visual and musical retelling of Jesus the Christ's manifestation to the world. Through pageantry, sacred readings, and congregational participation, worshipers are invited to reflect on the meaning of Epiphany: God's light revealed in the Christ for all people. This moving service offers a powerful worship opportunity during the Epiphany season, joining music, scripture, and ritual in a proclamation of the Christ's glory.
