
GOD IN FILM

Reading the Bible Honestly: Making Sense of an Ancient Text

The key to discovering the inspirational power of the Bible is to be unafraid to read it honestly. In order to do that you have to be unafraid to ask questions not only about what the Bible says, but about how the Bible came to be the Bible in the first place. This is called being a faithful skeptic, which is trusting that understanding the Bible is enhanced by questions rather than diminished by them. The goal is for all of us to gain a deeper appreciation for the Bible precisely because it was written by people like us to people like us so that all these years later people like us can appreciate and experience the story of God at work in the world just as they did.

What do we mean when we call something or someone evil? The word "evil" tends to conjure up images of demons, devils, and horrifying crimes, things with which we couldn't possibly get involved! But is that true? Is evil really something that is only found in wicked people who are "quite unlike ourselves"? Could it be that you and I are not only capable of doing evil things, but are already involved with such things? This book explores the hidden nature of evil and draws out the ways in which all of us, knowingly or otherwise, are caught up in webs of evil that bring about disastrous consequences, often to the weakest and most vulnerable amongst us. We need to find ways of learning to see evil and resisting it by all means possible. If we can't see evil, we can't resist it. If we can't resist it, we get sucked into it.


