ALPHA-GAL INFORMATION-SHARING GROUP TO MEET

It develops when a certain sugar that makes people have allergic reactions to red meat and other products from mammals is introduced into the body by a tick bite. For those who have been diagnosed or have a loved one who has been diagnosed with alpha-gal there will be an opportunity to share what you have experienced, what you have learned, how you are coping, and to learn from others with the diagnosis.
