LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE

Lutheran Disaster Response is coordinating relief work in the Middle East through the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land and Augusta Victoria Hospital, which is operated by the Lutheran World Federation. In addition to prayers, our support helps make possible medical supplies and accommodations for patients and staff unable to return to their homes in Gaza, emergency education support for families who have lost income due to the war and are unable to pay school fees, psycho social support, shelter, household items, public health centers, and direct cash assistance, focusing on the Palestinian communities in Gaza, East Jerusalem and the West Bank. Additionally, Lutheran Disaster Response is coordinating with Arab and Middle Eastern Ministries to provide interfaith emotional and spiritual care support for communities in the United States. All contributions to Lutheran Disaster Response are used in full (100 percent) to assist those directly impacted by the current acts of terror and warfare. 


ADVENT WREATH MAKING

REVISED HOLY TRINITY CONSTITUTION and INCORPORATION

It has been twenty-five years since Holy Trinity last updated its constitution and bylaws. During that time, our world has become more complex and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) has approved a number of changes that also impact synodical and congregational constitutions. Most of the ELCA changes are mandatory and must be included verbatim. In addition, since 2005, the Commonwealth of Virginia has allowed congregations to incorporate.

Our Church Council appointed a Constitution Task Group to work on this revision and incorporation process. We thank **Nancy Hall**, **Wade Neiman**, and **Deb Serio** for their efforts on this project. The Task Group has worked in tandem with a local attorney for the incorporation provisions, and with the Virginia Synod for overall review and ELCA compliance. Now that the attorney and the Virginia Synod have given their approval, the revised constitution, bylaws, and provisions for incorporation have been shared with the congregation via email. There are several printed copies available in the church office for review as well. The proposed revisions and incorporation were discussed at our Gifts Festival Breakfast and will be voted on at our Annual Congregational Meeting on December 3. Please speak with Pastor Roberts about any questions you may have.

RESERVATIONS FOR CHURCH EVENTS

We are reminded that it is very important to make reservations for church events at which food will be served. In addition to helping with food purchasing and preparation, it also helps us have sufficient seating pre-set and ready in the Fellowship Hall for luncheons, suppers, etc. Reservation forms for events are available in the narthex and Fellowship Hall, or one may call or email the church office. It is also helpful to make reservations in advance rather than wait until the day of the event.
