#### Vaccinations for Adults and Children: An Update on Requirements and a Discussion of Vaccine Controversy

Speaker: Lisa Barber, RN, Nursing Supervisor Central Virginia Health District

Vaccines have long been regarded as the greatest triumph in public health. Before systematic vaccination, communicable diseases such as polio, measles, mumps, and whooping cough caused many deaths, and significant cases of disability. People were fearful of these diseases and welcomed the coming of vaccines that prevented them. But with the success of vaccines, Americans in the previous two generations have not witnessed the ravages caused by these diseases. This and other societal factors have caused vaccination rates to decline and the result has been outbreaks of previously eliminated or nearly eliminated communicable diseases. Our speaker will give us an update on current vaccine requirements for adults and children and the latest on COVID-19 and flu vaccinations. She will discuss some of the issues behind declining rates of vaccination, the dangers caused by declining rates and ways providers and we as citizens can address this problem.
